CHURCH NURSERY PROPOSAL

Joy Bedard presenter:

For many years I have believed it was important for us to consistently staff the church nursery. Over the years, I have tried several times to recruit people to staff the nursery but have not been successful. When relying on volunteers, it ended up being hit and misses. If a family comes, expecting there to be a nursery and it is not staffed that day, it becomes a very stressful situation for them and they are less likely to return.

If we are interested in attracting families with young children to our church, staffing the nursery is a very simple step that we can take to be welcoming to them.

When families with young children come to Christ Lutheran, it can be stressful having a child in church and they may decide not to return.

The way the nursery is run now, it is not staffed. Some families recruit older children to stay in the nursery with their child or grandchild. I believe that this creates liability for Christ Lutheran Church.

Proposal:

- Establish a paid position. I recommend \$40.00/Sunday (approximate cost of \$1,440/year)
- Staff the nursery between 10:00 and 12:00 each Sunday during the school year.

- The person hired would be at least 18 years of age.
- Age served would be toddler to 6 years of age.

Goal:

- Make families with young children feel welcome at Christ Lutheran.
- Provide a safe nurturing environment for young children.
- Eliminate the need for older children to miss church to watch other children.
